Father Carl represented us well as he spoke to the Ottawa County Miami, Ministerial Alliance during Holy Week Services. I'd like to share his presentation on St. Rose of Lima: She was born in South America in the year 1586 in Lima Peru. St Rose was very pious and as beautiful as a rose. Against her parents' desire for her to marry, at the age of 20, she was given permission to join the Third Order of St. Dominic. She practiced extreme prayer, fasting and penance. Rose defaced her natural beauty, intentionally putting pepper and lye on her gorgeous complexion and cutting her lovely locks of hair to distract attention from herself. Nevertheless, she is said to have been one of the most beautiful people to ever live. She passed hours in prayer and engaged in mortification. This holy woman died at the age of 31. The Church canonized her in the year 1671, solemnly proclaiming that she practiced heroic virtue and lived in fidelity to God's grace with the power of the Spirit of holiness. She therefore sustains the hope of believers by being proposed as a model and intercessor. St. Rose is the first canonized saint of the New World, i.e. the Western Hemisphere, specifically the Americas. St. Rose of Lima is the patron saint for embroiderers, gardeners, florists, those who suffer ridicule for their piety and those who suffer from family problems.

Why all this talk to our protestant neighbors about a saint of the New World? Father Carl mentioned St. Rose to challenge those present to "fix our focus on the crucifix." St. Rose of Lima stated, "Apart from the cross there is no other ladder by which we may get to heaven." Listen to that again. I find this statement profound and a concise statement of the truth the Church has proclaimed throughout almost two millennia of Christianity. "Apart from the cross there is no other ladder by which we may get to heaven." For many of our protestant friends, this may have been the first time they had ever heard an explanation of why Catholics honor the Saints. Thank you Father, for evangelizing and educating our community on our Sacred History and the authority of the Church to not only proclaim persons to the Sainthood but to call each us to follow in their paths.


