However, their biggest “building” challenge was not the temple. Haggai reports poor harvests, misplaced priorities, lackluster devotion, and poor morale. Spiritual paralysis has set in. Malachi battled priest scandals, rampant divorce, religious indifference, wage controversies and oppression of the poor. Does this sound familiar?

Jesus asked St. Francis of Assisi to “rebuild my church.” Not a church of brick and mortar but the “people of God.” What spiritual building projects does the Church face today? What are the challenges? How are you participating in His rebuilding project?

Federal Legislation

"Our Pro-Life movement fight has clear battle lines. It's easier to defeat an enemy who identifies himself. After Roe v Wade, the political parties gradually solidified their positions each year.
