Mission Co-Op

Throughout the Diocese we join our prayers and resources to support the missions. On the weekend of August 12, Fr. Timothy M. Kremen, O.S.M., of The Order of Friar Servants of Mary (Servites)-USA Province, will share their missionary work in the Republic of South Africa. Our pastor Fr. Carl will be with Deacon Erick Bell and other souls for a mission trip to the other side of the Mexican border in Allende.

The Servites are one of the mendicant orders and were founded in the 13th century in Florence, Italy. At the present time they serve all over the world in every type of apostolate.

The USA Province of Servites is responsible for the missions in KwaZulu-Natal. The main task of the missionaries today continues to be the proclamation of the Gospel and the establishment of viable Catholic communities. The idea that the people are the church is quite strong and participation in the liturgy and the work of the Church is very good. Other ministries include education, primary health care centers and providing funding to improve the water system to root out malaria. They are also ministering to people of the area. They are in need of prayers and material help to carry on these ministries. God Bless you for your prayers and financial assistance. Donations diocesan-wide will be distributed among the participating missionaries.

Handling Migration Challenges

How do you respond to strangers in relationship with yourself, your family and your community? Fear and protection or hospitality and protection extended to strangers? In Sacred Scripture at God's bidding Abraham migrated to a new land, Jacob and the Israelites followed Joseph to Egypt, and Israel flees Egypt as refugees.

How should one treat an alien? See Lev. 19:33-34. The Holy Family also became refugees at the time of the Nativity. America has a rich history of receiving European, sometimes oppressed, immigrants, followed by Asia, the Middle East, and our southern neighbors. The word "parish" itself means "sojourners." Recall that "Our citizenship is in heaven" - Phil 3:30.

The preferential option for the poor, orphan, widow, and alien has been a consistent goal by hospitable Jews and Christians. St. Paul emphasizes the dignity of each person, Jew or Gentile, free or slave, all being made in the image and likeness of God. The Church's social Gospel compels us to provide loving treatment of migrants and refugees that respects human dignity, independent of legal status, while simultaneously recognizing the right to protect one's borders. May God guide us through this "difficult, complex and controversial issue." Love God and neighbor!
