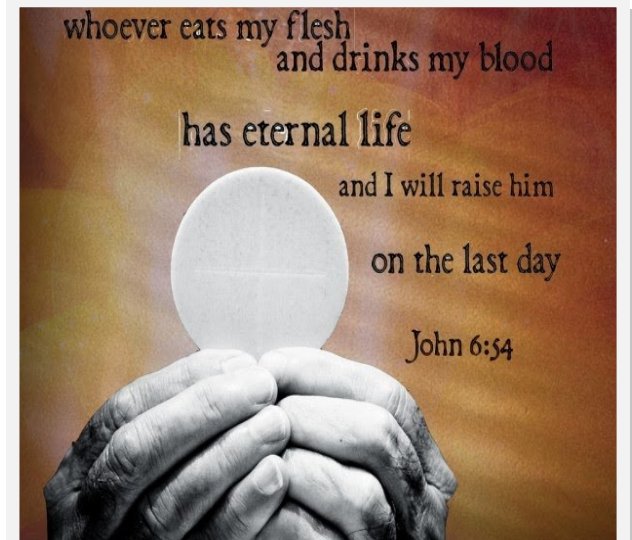

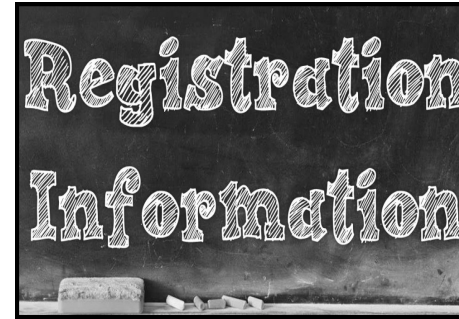
Big changes are coming to this year's Religious Education Classes! Class times will remain the same each week—5:00—6:00 p.m. for grades Pre-K through 8th grade and 6:30- 8:00 p.m. for High School dinner and lesson. **HOWEVER**, the last Wednesday of each month, we are changing things up by having a “Family Night/ Pot Luck Supper” and a Presentation by students in selected grades. **On the last Wednesday of each month, class will begin at 6:00 and last until 7:15.** Bishop Konderla is asking that each parish create and participate in a more family centered catechesis program. We can help him reach his goals for our diocese by coming together once a month as a church family and sharing a meal and giving our kids an opportunity to show off their knowledge and understanding of the Catholic Faith. The first Family Night is scheduled for Wednesday, August 29th from 6:00— to 7:15 and will consist of dinner, followed by our High Students giving a report of their trip to the Steubenville Praise and Worship Conference in Springfield last month. It will close with an Open House in the RE Building, giving parents and students a chance to meet the teachers and see their classrooms. Be sure to register your children as soon as possible so we can make sure all supplies and textbooks are ordered and ready to go for our kids. Remember to bring a dish of your choice for the evening meal.

Deadline for registration is Sunday August 25th. If your child is enrolling in a sacrament prep class, we'll need a copy of their baptismal certificate attached to the registration form.

Seven of our Sacred Heart teachers are planning to attend this year's Catechetical Conference in Tulsa on Saturday, August 18. Keynote speakers are Dr. Scott Han, Professor of Theology at Franciscan University of Steubenville and well -known author, his wife Kimberly Hahn, author and Catholic Apologist and Hector Molina, Catholic Speaker and Evangelist from Casting Net's Ministries. The conference will end with the Bishop's Mass and Blessing of the Catechists at 5:00 p.m. at Holy Family Cathedral. Please pray for our volunteer catechists that God will bless and guide our teachers who give their gifts of time and talent to pass on the Catholic faith to your children. Be sure to thank them when you see them and let them know how much you appreciate their efforts.

The Assumption Explained - To be “assumed” means to be taken up by God bodily into Heaven. We do not just acknowledge that Mary's soul was taken to Heaven, as is the case with the rest of the faithful who are taken there (likely after purgation); rather, Mary was taken up, soul *and* body, after her sojourn on this earth was complete. There is no earthly tomb containing her body, neither are there relics of her body to be found among the Christian faithful.

The Assumption Extended to Us – The Feast of the Assumption is of theological interest and provides matter for biblical reflection, but eventually these questions are bound to arise: So what? How does what happened to Mary affect my life? What does it mean for me? The answers are bound up in nearly every Marian doctrine. Simply put, what happened to Mary will also happen to us in the end. As Mary bore Christ into the world, we bear Him in the Holy Communion we receive and in the witness of His indwelling presence in our life. As Mary is (and always was) sinless (immaculate), so too will we one day be sinless with God in Heaven. As Mary cared for Christ in His need, so do we care for Him in the poor, suffering, needy, and afflicted. Finally, as Mary was assumed, body and soul, into Heaven, so too will we be there one day, body and soul.
