

Saturday of Memorial Day weekend ten men were ordained to the priesthood by Bishop Carl Kemme, including one from Sacred Heart Parish, Miami, OK. Congratulations and prayers for their blessed service in the name of the Lord. This Sunday Fr. Jurgensmeyer will preside and preach at 9:30 a.m. Mass while the pastor is away on vacation. First Blessings, which are extra special for the first year of ordination, will be given after Mass in the expanded church vestibule.

Sacred Heart Parish, Miami has given two gifts for priestly ministry. First, a paten and chalice were received from Knights of Columbus Black Mountain Assembly #2476 in Bullhead City, Arizona where Bobbie J. Potts of our parish served in the 4th Degree before dying in January of 2016. Secondly, a traveling Mass kit, weighing only three pounds, was given for anticipated trips where the nearest church makes it impractical to travel to consecrated space to offer the Sacred Liturgy. **Building Fund Financial Update:**

Our Building Project is complete except for the repair and installment of the threshold at the main entrance into the Church. Our current financial status is this:

The parish **WILL NOT** need to borrow **ANY** money from the Diocese of Tulsa. However, we have borrowed a total of \$253,000 to date, from our own Sacred Heart savings account. This amazing accomplishment is the result of many generous donors who contributed large amounts of money to insure we have a beautiful, safe, and updated facility without having to pay a **single penny in interest!** It also is the result of many others who pledged and continue to contribute \$10, \$25, \$35 and \$50 each month. These donations, spread over the next 3 or 4 years will go directly back into our First National Bank account to replenish our savings and allow us to once again have the security of knowing we are financially solvent and totally free from debt. Few parishes our size are able to boast of such an amazing accomplishment. We should be proud of ourselves for the generosity and commitment to the Parish. Not only that, we should be grateful that we are able to continue the legacy that our parents, grandparents and even great-grandparents sacrificed to leave us. My family still tells of the early days when their parents struggled to build and pay for "the big, new church" on the outskirts of town. The turkey dinners, bazaars, bingos and other fundraisers were labors of love from families who struggled to make ends meet at home but still insisted on growing the Catholic Church in Eastern Oklahoma. From the original parish building over on West Central to our beautiful campus today, the continued sacrifice, dedication and love of the Catholic Faith from this church family sends a strong message to the city of Miami and surrounding community that Sacred Heart Parish is here to stay and in a **GRAND** way! I will continue to post the monthly amounts contributed and deposited back into our savings account until the day we have a **GREAT** celebration and once again, totally retire our debt. Good job, Sacred Heart!

A special note of thanks goes to Terry Jurgensmeyer, our truly **outstanding** Fundraising Chairman and Judge Robert Reavis for keeping the builders on track. Our beautiful new room could not have progressed so quickly without the hard work of these two men as they guided this project to completion.

In the Gospel reading today our Lord states that a house is divided against itself cannot stand. The context of this statement is the accusation leveled against Jesus that He was driving out demons by Beelzebul. So our Lord said if Satan has risen against himself, he cannot stand; it is the end of him. It's obvious the Evil one has been given this ability to cause trouble for us, We must realize we are under siege and being tempted to be divided.

In the first reading we hear about the aftermath of choice made by our first parents when they were tempted by the serpent. They were in the state of grace when Satan slithered into the Garden. They knew God's will and His command to them, but they chose to listen to the subtle lies of the Devil and fell prey to his wiles. In doing this they became divided within themselves, as well as with God, one another, and all of creation.

There is the tension between the body and the soul, there is the choice between God and what He has revealed and Satan and his subtle temptations, If we profess to have the spirit of faith, then it is necessary to live in accordance with that spirit. We live in a world where God is escorted out while the red carpet is rolled out for Satan. These kinds of dichotomies within our lives leave us very vulnerable to being a house divided. We know we are to live according to the spirit of faith, but the things of the body appear more appealing than the things that are good for the soul.

We know it is only through the cross that we are purified and by death that we enter into eternal life. God's truth and His ways have not changed, so if there is something which gravitates against God and His truth, it is a lie. We know the enemy of our souls will use anything to confuse us, but if we give into the Devil's lies, we are a house divided. If we live by the spirit of faith, we are God's house, the strongman's house that cannot be plundered because the Strongman dwells within. (USCCB)
