What's so special about a new Priest's First Blessings?

The ordination of new priests and the Mass they were ordained to offer remind us that Christ is still the head of His Church, and His goal for the Church, the salvation of souls, lies beyond this world. The priesthood is a great gift, one not given for the individual but for the good and salvation of all. The First Blessings of the new priest serve to remind us that the One, True church will withstand the gates of Hell, as long as young men continue to answer His call. Please come and kneel before our newest priest, Father Nic and receive God's blessings and graces that are centuries old but ever new. Congratulations, Fr. Nic!



It was a humble nun in Belgium, Saint Juliana (1258), Prioress of Mont Cornillon, who first suggested and advocated a special feast in honor of the Blessed Sacrament to be celebrated on a day other than Maundy Thursday. From her sixteenth year she had often in her prayers beheld a strange sight: it was as if the full moon appeared to her in brilliant light, while a part of its disc remained black and lightless. Finally, in a vision, Christ showed her the meaning of this picture. The moon represented the ecclesiastical year; the black spot indicated the lack of a festival in honor of the Blessed Sacrament. She was to announce to the authorities of the Church that God wished such a feast to be established.

In 1230 Juliana communicated her secret to a small group of learned theologians. As her message became publicly known, she had to suffer scorn and ridicule for some years. But the bishop of her diocese (Liège) and some of his canons eventually lent a willing ear to her appeals. A diocesan synod in 1246 decided in her favor and prescribed such a feast for the churches of Liège.

Was it mere coincidence that one of the men who had supported her efforts in Belgium later became pope? Upon his election to the papal office, Pope Urban IV (1261-1265) On September 8, 1264, established for the whole Church the festival, now known by all Catholics, the Feast of Corpus Christi was declared in honor of the Holy Eucharist, which the saintly nun had proclaimed to be willed by God. It was to be celebrated with great solemnity on the Thursday after Pentecost week, and indulgences were granted to all who would receive Holy Communion or attend special devotions in addition to hearing Mass.— Learn more at Catholic Culture.org
